Liz Livermore has visited Chile twice, both times with expert botanist guides (Martin Gardner and Sabina Knees of Edinburgh Botanic Garden, and David Hazelgove, past President of the Alpine Garden Society, and Daniel Montesinos, a Peruvian botanist who has described 29 new species in the Andes mountains). His Lordship's Food and Flowers

As a young man of 17, Thomas Challis went to work as an undergardener in the wonderful gardens at Audley End, arriving in June 1795 and staying until 1798. Thomas was literate and kept a recently discovered, neatly written diary of his daily work, which reveals a fascinating picture of what was going on in the vegetable and flower gardens of a great county house in the early Regency period. Susan Jellis has transcribed his diaries for English Heritage. There will be time for questions and refreshments after her talk. Members £2, guests £5.


A Guided Tour of the Gardens at Audley End House

NATIONAL GARDEN SCHEME OPENING AT GROVE LODGE, SAFFRON WALDEN

3 CHATERS HILL, SAFFRON WALDEN CB10 2AB

This large walled garden close to the town centre has unusually high biodiversity and its light free-draining chalk soil allows bulbs, hellebores and winter-flowering shrubs to thrive.

Sunday 23rd February and Sunday March 16th from 14:00 to 17:00

In February you can see the tail-end of the aconites, thousands of snowdrops, the start of crocuses and daffodils, hundreds of hellebores with Daphnes and possibly Sarcocca starting to flower. Though the snowdrops will be starting to fade by March, the daffodils will be at their peak and there should still be variegated Daphne flowering, as well as hyacinths and hundreds of violets and primroses.

Sunday 15th June

Though the Spring flowers will be gone, June is the time for geraniums, alliums, and campanulae. There are plans for music too - a woodwind quartet and possibly tunes from the keyboard.

Other Information

Admision is £6, and refreshments will be on sale. (I can personally reccommend the cakes - delicious!)
